The Deputy Supervisor called the Public Hearing to order at 6:52 P.M. and the Town Clerk read the notice as published in the Daily News.

Chris Mueller, Manager of Government Affairs for Time Warner Cable briefly addressed the Town Board. This is a standard ten-year agreement that was negotiated with Councilwoman Michalak and Time Warner. The term length of the agreement, the percent the Town receives, the minimum number of dwelling units per linear mile and extended service area where some of the amends made from the original proposed renewal agreement.

Councilwoman Michalak questioned the possibility of servicing Ashley Furniture on Call Parkway, which is in close proximity of Saile Drive. This wasn't negotiated in the agreement. Mr. Mueller would have to have their engineer review it. He can't commit to it at this time.

Deputy Supervisor Underhill declared the Public Hearing closed at 6:57 P.M. as no one spoke for or against the Time Warner Cable Franchise Renewal.
