FINAL ORDER ESTABLISHING
CREEK AND EAST ROAD WATER DISTRICT
FEBRUARY 20, 2013

WHEREAS, the Batavia Town Board (herein called “Town Board” and “Town”, respectively), in the County of Genesee, New York, has received a petition pursuant to Section 191 of the Town Law, for the establishment of Creek and East Road Water District (the “District”), which petition was signed by a number of owners within the District and was greater than the percentage required by law; and

WHEREAS, such petition was accompanied by a map, plan and report, dated May 2010 and updated October 2012, prepared by the Town of Batavia Engineering Department, competent engineers duly licensed by the State of New York, for the establishment of the District; and

WHEREAS, such map, plan and report is on file at the office of the Town Clerk, and available for public inspection at said location; and

WHEREAS, said proposed improvements consist of a project to provide a safe and reliable potable water supply and fire protection to certain residences in the District; and

WHEREAS, the overall project will consist of the construction and installation of approximately 22,000 linear feet of eight inch water main along portions of Creek Road, East Road, Lehigh Road and Dorman Road, as more fully identified in such map, plan and report referred to above, together with all related right-of-way costs, site work and other ancillary work, including hydrants, valves, apparatus, and other improvements and costs incidental thereto (referred to herein as “water improvement”); and

WHEREAS, the estimated maximum amount proposed to be expended for the construction of such District is estimated to be \$1,220,600; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Order duly adopted on November 19, 2012, the Town Board determined to proceed with the proposed establishment of the District and adopted an Order reciting a description of the boundaries of the District, the improvements proposed, the maximum amount proposed to be expended for the construction of water improvements in connection with the establishment of the District, the proposed method of financing to be employed, the fact that a map, plan and report describing the same is on file in the Town Clerk’s office and is available for public inspection and specifying December 5, 2012, at 6:30 o’clock p.m. (Prevailing Time) as the time when, and the Batavia Town Hall, located at 3833 West Main Street Road, in the Town, as the place where, the Town Board would meet to consider the proposed establishment of the District and to hear all persons interested in the subject thereof

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concerning the same, and for such other action on the part of the Town Board in relation thereto, as may be required by law; and

WHEREAS, following publication and posting of certified copies of said Order pursuant to Article 12 of the Town Law and after a public hearing duly held by the Town Board at the time and place herein referred to, the Town Board, by resolution duly adopted December 5, 2012, determined that the notice of public hearing was published and posted as required by law and was otherwise sufficient, that all the property and property owners included within the proposed District were benefited thereby, that all the property and property owners benefited were included within the limits of the proposed District, that it was in the public interest to establish the District and approved the establishment of the District and the construction of water improvements in connection with the District as hereinabove described at an estimated maximum cost of \$1,220,600; and that the plan of financing is for the issuance of serial bonds in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$1,220,600, said amount to be offset by the receipt of any federal, state, county and/or local funds including, but not limited to, a USDA Rural Development Agency grant of approximately \$500,000; and unless paid from other sources or charges, the costs for the establishment of the District will be by the assessment, levy and collection of special assessments from the several lots and parcels of land within the District, which the Town Board shall determine to be especially benefited by said District, so much upon and from each as shall be in just proportion to the amount of benefit which the District shall confer upon the same, to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable; and

WHEREAS, permission of the State Comptroller was required with respect to the establishment of the District and the Town submitted an application to the office of the State Comptroller, Department of Audit and Control; and

WHEREAS, the Office of the State Comptroller, Department of Audit and Control reviewed such application and on February 11, 2013, the State Comptroller issued an order that such application of the Town Board of the Town of Batavia for permission to establish Creek and East Road Water District was approved and permitted the establishment of said District in accordance with the description referred to in a resolution of December 5, 2012, at an estimated maximum cost of \$1,220,600;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

ORDERED, that the establishment of the District is hereby approved, in the Town of Batavia, to be known as Creek and East Road Water District, situate wholly outside of any incorporated village or city, and is bounded and described as follows:

The boundary of the proposed Town of Batavia Creek & East Road Water District includes all that tract or parcel of land situated in the Town of Batavia, County of Genesee, State of New York, being described as follows:

Beginning at a point which is the intersection of the centerline of Creek Road and the Batavia/Alexander Municipal Boundary; thence,

1. Westerly, along the Batavia/Alexander Municipal Boundary, a distance of 2,325 feet, more or less, to the intersection of the centerline of the Tonawanda Creek and the Batavia/Alexander Municipal Boundary; thence,

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2. Northerly, along the centerline of the Tonawanda Creek, a distance of 21,164 feet, more or less, to the intersection of the centerline of the Tonawanda Creek and the City of Batavia Municipal Boundary; thence,
3. Easterly, along the City of Batavia Municipal Boundary, a distance of 2,108 feet, more or less, to a northeasterly corner of Tax Parcel number 13.-1-103.2; thence,
4. Southeasterly, along the northeasterly line of Tax Parcel number 13.-1-103.2, a distance of 403 feet, more or less, to a northeasterly corner of Tax Parcel number 13.-1-103.2; thence,
5. Southerly, along the easterly line of Tax Parcel number 13.-1-103.2, a distance of 233 feet, more or less, to the southeasterly corner of Tax Parcel number 13.-1-103.2; thence,
6. Westerly, along the southerly line of Tax Parcel number 13.-1-103.2, a distance of 956 feet, more or less, to the southwesterly corner of Tax Parcel number 13.-1-103.2; thence,
7. Southerly, along the easterly line of Tax Parcel number 13.-1-104.1, a distance of 608 feet, more or less, to the southeasterly corner of Tax Parcel number 13.-1-104.1; thence,
8. Westerly, along the southerly line of Tax Parcel number 13.-1-104.1, a distance of 875 feet, more or less, to the southwesterly corner of tax Parcel number 13.-1-104.1; thence,
9. Northerly, along an westerly line of Tax Parcel number 13.-1-104.1, a distance of 19 feet, more or less, to a southeasterly corner of Tax Parcel number 12.-1-56.1; thence,

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Batavia, Genesee County, New York (the "Town"), pursuant to Article 12 of the Town Law, created a water district designated and known as the "Creek and East Road Water District" (the "District"); and

WHEREAS, the Town Board desires to undertake a water system capital improvements project generally consisting of the construction of the infrastructure for the District (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, by Resolutions the Town Board took the following actions with respect to the Project:(a) prepared maps, plans and reports and identified the boundaries for the District and the

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Project, (b) held public hearings with respect to the Project, (c) determined that the Project would not have a significant effect on the environment under Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law, (d) determined that the requirements of Article 12 of the Town Law had been satisfied with respect to the Project and further determined to undertake the Project and (e) received permission to establish the District from the New York State Comptroller; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board desires to issue obligations of the Town to finance the costs of the Project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, by the Town Board (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of the Board) as follows:

SECTION 1: The specific purpose (hereinafter referred to as “purpose”) to be financed pursuant to this resolution is a certain capital improvements project consisting of the construction and installation of approximately 22,000 linear feet of eight inch water main along portions of Creek Road, East Road, Lehigh Road and Dorman Road, as more fully identified in a certain map, plan and report referred to above and prepared in connection with the Project, together with all related right-of-way costs, site work and other ancillary work, including hydrants, valves, apparatus, and other improvements and costs incidental thereto for the foregoing purpose. The estimated maximum cost of said purpose is \$1,220,600.

SECTION 2: The Town Board plans to finance the estimated maximum cost of said purpose by the issuance of serial bonds in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$1,220,600 of the Town, said amount to be offset by the receipt of any federal, state, county and/or local funds received including, but not limited to, a USDA Rural Development Agency grant of approximately \$500,000, and, unless paid from other sources or charges, the costs of said purpose shall be paid by the assessment, levy and collection of special assessments from the several lots and parcels of land within the District, which the Town Board shall determine and specify to be especially benefited thereby, so much upon and from each as shall be in just proportion to the amount of benefit conferred upon the same, to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable, except as provided by law.

SECTION 3: It is hereby determined that said purpose is an object or purpose described in subdivision 1 of paragraph (a) of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law, and that the period of probable usefulness of said purpose is 40 years.

SECTION 4: Current funds are not required to be provided prior to the issuance of the bonds authorized by this resolution or any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds.

SECTION 5: It is hereby determined the proposed maturity of the obligations authorized by this resolution will be in excess of five years.

SECTION 6: The faith and credit of the Town are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds (and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds) as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds or notes becoming due and

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payable in such year. Unless paid from other sources or charges, the costs of the Project shall be paid by the assessment, levy and collection of special assessments from the several lots and parcels of land within the District which the Town Board shall determine and specify to be especially benefited thereby, so much upon and from each as shall be in just proportion to the amount of benefit conferred upon the same, to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds or notes as the same become due and payable, except as provided by law.

SECTION 7: Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Local Finance Law, pursuant to the provisions of Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes or the renewals of said notes and of Section 21.00, Section 50.00, Sections 56.00 to 60.00, Section 62.00 and Section 63.00 of the Local Finance Law, the powers and duties of the Town Board pertaining or incidental to the sale and issuance of the obligations herein authorized, including but not limited to authorizing bond anticipation notes and prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the bonds herein authorized and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said notes, are hereby delegated to the Town Supervisor, the chief fiscal officer of the Town. Without in any way limiting the scope of the foregoing delegation of powers, the Town Supervisor, to the extent permitted by Section 58.00(f) of the Local Finance Law, is specifically authorized to accept bids submitted in electronic format for any bonds or notes of the Town.

SECTION 8: The temporary use of available funds of the Town, not immediately required for the purpose or purposes for which the same were borrowed, raised or otherwise created, is hereby authorized pursuant to Section 165.10 of the Local Finance Law, for the purpose or purposes described in Section 1 of this resolution. The Town then reasonably expects to reimburse any such expenditures (to the extent made after the date hereof or within 60 days prior to the date hereof) with the proceeds of the bonds authorized by Section 2 of this resolution (or with the proceeds of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds). This resolution shall constitute the declaration of the Town's "official intent" to reimburse the expenditures authorized by Section 2 hereof with such bond or note proceeds, as required by United States Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 9: The Town Supervisor is further authorized to take such actions and execute such documents as may be necessary to ensure the continued status of the interest on the bonds authorized by this resolution, and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, as excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes pursuant to Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and to designate the bonds authorized by this resolution, and any notes issued in anticipation thereof as "qualified tax-exempt bonds" in accordance with Section 265(b)(3)(B)(i) of the Code.

SECTION 10: The Town Supervisor is further authorized to enter into a continuing disclosure agreement with the initial purchaser of the bonds or notes authorized by this resolution, containing provisions which are satisfactory to such purchaser in compliance with the provisions of Rule 15c2-12, promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

SECTION 11: The Town has complied with applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations regarding environmental matters, including compliance with the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"), comprising Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation

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Law and, in connection therewith, duly issued a negative declaration and/or other applicable documentation, and therefore, no further action under the State Environmental Quality Review Act is necessary.

SECTION 12: The Town Supervisor is hereby authorized to execute and deliver in the name and on behalf of the Town a project financing agreement prepared by the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation (“EFC”) (the “SRF Project Financing Agreement”). The Town Supervisor and all other officers, employees and agents of the Town are hereby authorized and directed for and on behalf of the Town to execute and deliver all certificates and other documents, perform all acts and do all things required or contemplated to be executed, performed or done by this resolution or any document or agreement approved hereby, including, but not limited to, the SRF Project Financing Agreement.

SECTION 13: In the absence or unavailability of the Town Supervisor, the Deputy Supervisor is hereby specifically authorized to exercise the powers delegated to the Town Supervisor in this resolution.

SECTION 14: The validity of said serial bonds or of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said serial bonds may be contested only if:

(1) (a) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the Town is not authorized to expend money, or

(b) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with, and

an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication; or

(2) Said obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution of New York.

SECTION 15: This resolution is effective immediately.
